REGISTRATION PROCEDURE

CONFIRMATION PROCEDURE

1. On receipt of the registration form, the parent (guardian) will be notified if the player will be registered in to the requested program(s). Participants registering into programs that are filled to capacity will be either notified of alternatives or put on a waiting list.
2. Written confirmation package will be issued once the school has been filled to capacity or approximately one month prior to commencement of the hockey school, whichever occurs first.
3. The confirmation package will contain additional information and notice of changes.
4. On the first day of the program, please bring the confirmation letter with you to the registration desk.

EQUIPMENT POLICY

Before any player is allowed on the ice the player must be dressed in all of the appropriate and properly fitting hockey equipment including helmet and neck guard.

CANCELLATION OR REFUND POLICY

All cancellation requests must be submitted in writing. A full refund will be issued providing the cancellation request is received before August 1st, 2012. After August 1st, only emergency cancellation due to illness and/or injury will be accepted. The cancellation must have supporting medical certificate(s) and will be handled on a case-by-case basis. An administrative fee will be charged. Note: No show - no refund! Fees are non-refundable to participants if they do not attend or complete the hockey school.
